




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Building Beauty India is an **international study program**, affiliated with the Building Beauty Program that began at Sorrento at San Anna University in 2017, based on the teachings and theory of Christopher Alexander, theorist, architect, mathematician, scientist, and artist, who taught at the University of California, Berkley for nearly 40 years.

At the core of the programme is **WHOLENESS** of **LIFE** *as* **BEAUTY**. A study in the interconnected three fields of :

- 1. Philosophy & Aesthetics
- 2. Design & Making, and
- 3. History & Society

This post graduate program is open to architects and non-architects alike, who may have an interest in learning about building their habitat in particular the architecture that is connected with life holistically. So far the program has been attended by architects, artists, software persons, engineers, historians, anthropologists, journalists, doctors, and writers.

In India this program is offered jointly by GREHA, New Delhi and the Centre for Development and Sustainable Activities (CDSA), Pune.

Teaching: Teaching would be offered at the venue, in a combination of Offline and also Online classes.

Faculty: The faculty comprises of experienced practicing Architects, Anthropologists, Ecologists, Historians, Sociologists, Philosophers & Critics, and Practitioners in various crafts from within India and also from other countries.





Reading Text



This course forms a theoretical backbone of the Building Beauty India program. Students will study **three key texts** - *The Nature of Order* (all four books), *A Pattern Language*, and *A Discovery of Architecture- A Contemporary Treatise on Ancient Values and Indigenous Reality*. Theoretical understanding of these three texts provides foundation to the projects in Design and Craft studio and construction works. Reading before class is required.

Nature of Order Books I, II, III, IV

Book-I, *The Phenomenon of Life* Book-II, *The Process of Creating Life* Book-III, *A Vision of a Living World* Book-IV, *The Luminous Ground*

The four books of The Nature of Order redefine architecture for the 21st century as a field, as a profession, as practice and as social philosophy. Each of the books deals with one facet of the discipline. This worldview provides architecture with a new underpinning, describing procedures of planning, design, and building, as well as attitudes to style, to the shapes of buildings, and to the forms of urbanisation and construction.

The four books, each one an essay on the topic of living structure, are connected and interdependent. Each sheds light on one facet of living structure: first, the definition; second, the process of generating living structure; third, the practical vision of an architecture guided by the concept of living structure; and fourth, the cosmological underpinnings and implications brought into being by the idea of living structure. The books offer a view of a human-centered universe, a view of order, in which the soul, or human feeling and the soul, play a central role



A Pattern Language

Volume I, *The Timeless Way of Building*, and Volume II, *A Pattern Language*, are two halves of a single work. This book provides a language, for building, and planning; the other book provides the theory and instructions for the use of the language. This book describes the detailed patterns for towns and neighbourhoods, houses, gardens, and rooms, the other book explains the discipline which makes it possible to use these patterns to create a building or a town. This book is the sourcebook of the timeless way; the other is its practices.

A Discovery of Architecture: A Contemporary Treatise on Ancient Values and Indigenous Reality

Architecture is an ancient discipline, and the results of its thinking and endeavour provides us with some of the most lasting examples of our culture.... It is possible that we have lost the ability to learn from and derive inspiration for contemporary architecture from the indigenous realities? ... Physical reality is perceived by the individual self, and is given meaning by the community.... When self assumes the nature of community, there is a creative interaction which results in action coupled with awareness.

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
This course is a conversation exploring the interconnections between the self, society, and nature. Through this process students will discover the sense of wholeness that underlies life. This exploration will include :

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



Short Seminar 1

Fibre to Fabric - Learning by observing, doing and sharing



Shubhra Singh Textile Designer and Architect

Session 1Introduction to a Material and demonstration of the technique of SpinningTo acquaint the students with the understanding of the nature of material in its variousforms, the life cycle of a fibre (Cotton) would be shared and discussed. Practicaldemonstrations of the technique of Spinning (2-3 variations) will take place followed byhands-on practice.

Session **2** Introduction to Textile Techniques

To understand the premise of Creation, a few textile techniques will be demonstrated followed by discussion. Students would be expected to be present, to learn with an open heart, to understand the logic and to take notes.

Session **3** In the search for locating the notions of Wholeness and Beauty

Combining the understanding drawn from the demonstrations followed by practice, practice and more practice.


Session 4 Locating_Being


Short Seminar 2

Reflections on the Nature of Crisis in the Study of Philosophy & Literature



Rajendra Dengle Former Professor, the Centre for German Studies, J N U New Delhi

- Session **1** Begin with an inquiry into the question of methodology as a meta-discipline in the European History of Thought. From the Positivism Debates in the 1960's, and reconstructing empiricist and rationalist arguments to come to some understanding of Kant's *Phenomenalism* and August Comte's Positivist philosophy and their influence on understanding literature, language, and culture 'scientifically'.
- Session 2 The students would be encouraged to problematise the writing of literary history, whereby the focus would be to understand the historical need to understand and overcome the limitations of Enlightenment and Realism in the changing literary praxis of Romanticism. The subject-object dichotomy, which is significant for the Self & Wholeness discussion, will be taken up with reference to literary movements such as Expressionism and Surrealism. Having thus sketched out the crises of living in Modernity and attempted to develop some understanding of the movement from *Phenomenalism* to *Phenomenology*, it would be important to look at some of the methodological reflections as "answers" to these questions.
- Session 3 Engaging with Philosophy of Language. How is it possible to create meaning and communicate in language? How does literature work to encourage in the reader a willingness to develop a historical consciousness and a competence to experience the reality of the Self and the Other? Some of the significant insights provided by the Russian Formalists and the Prague Structuralists would be discussed.
 Reading excerpts from some classic texts from the German speaking cultural space, which belong to World Literature and have been translated into English. For instance: Excerpts from Goethe's *Faust*, Hofmannsthal's The *Letter of Lord Chandos*, some poems by Rainer Maria Rilke, Hesse's *Siddhartha*, and Kafka's *The Hunger Artist*,



Aneeta Gokhale-Benninger Professor of Sustainable Development Planning, CDSA, Pune Creation of beauty with healing properties is at the core of Alexandrian design. Beauty has to be created within a real context for real people within a relationship of give-andtake between the designer and the users. Dialogue and discussion between the two will create data. Analysis of this data will give information about the people's behaviour, needs and preferences, and this will inform the design needs and preferences of materials etc. of the designer.

In order to be able to be engaged with the people in a non-controversial and productive dialogue and discussion, one needs to understand their socio- cultural, socio-economic and socio-political context. Sociology, Social Anthropology and Political Economy offer us tools and techniques for these studies.

The pedagogy will consist of reading, discussions and experiential learning by carrying out surveys in a village, a hutment, a co operative society and a gated community. This would familiarise the student with a cross section of rural and urban society in India.


The Short Seminar on Sociology will be offered in two parts - one in first semester and another in second semester.

Presentation of application of the attributes by students on their own/any other dwelling.



Wholeness and Beauty in Ancient Indian Text




Vibhuti Sachdev Architect, Conservation Consultant and Writer

Fundamentals of Indian Music and its Relation with Architecture





This short seminar introduces Cinema as a powerful tool for socio-political, aesthetic and architectural change and development.



About the Workshop:

The workshop focuses on making a small structure with rammed earth walls and timber roof frame inside and for the MW Campus. It introduces participants to very basic earth and timber construction hand work skills and techniques and the use of hand and machine tools therein. During the 7 day workshop, training in basic improved hand tools and a few machine tools for timber work will be introduced. The timber and earth construction instruction will overlap on the 4th and 5th day after the first 3 days of only earth construction sessions. Day 4 to Day 6 will be for making the timber truss and roof structure along with rammed earth wall construction ongoing until Day 4. Day 7 will be focused on placing the slate roofing slabs and final finishing of the structure including façade fenestration and then culminating in a feedback and discussion session. Earth construction session will go on for 4 days.


